

PLEASE READ CAFEULLY BEFORE YOU APPLY TO SEE IF YOU QUALIFY FOR AN APPRENTICESHIP WITH SASKATCHEWAN APPRENTICESHIP AND TRADE CERTIFICATION COMMISSION (SATCC)

Entrance requirements for individual trades have been established by the Saskatchewan Apprenticeship and Trade Certification Commission (SATCC) in consultation with industry, stakeholders and the essential skills profiles.

Individuals must be a **permanent resident of Canada** in order to apprentice.

Your completed **grade twelve transcript**, Canadian Adult Education Credential (**CAEC**) or General Education Development (**GED**) is your guarantee that you meet the educational entrance requirements for apprenticeship in Saskatchewan.

Individuals with "modified" or "general" classes in math or science do not meet our entry requirements.

The **SATCC** works hard to ensure that people find success in the apprenticeship program by accessing IXL Learning. Through computer-based online learning, it helps people to update their literacy and math skills. People will be referred to IXL Learning by the SATCC's Assessment Unit. Most commonly, clients who do not have the necessary entrance requirements, or need to upgrade various skills during technical training will be referred to the program.

IXL Learning's skills are aligned to the Saskatchewan Curriculum Outcomes providing comprehensive coverage of Math and English Language Arts concepts and applications. Clients taking Entrance Requirements Training will have six (6) months to complete the training and must meet the required score in each learning outcome. Once complete, and if all other admission requirements have been met, the client will be notified that they qualify to move forward with apprenticeship. Access to this program will be provided for a fee of \$25.

English is the language of instruction in all apprenticeship programs and is the common language for business in Saskatchewan. Before admission, all apprentices must be able to understand and communicate in the English language. Applicants whose first language is not English must have a minimum Canadian Language Benchmark Assessment of six (CLB6) in all areas. If you have completed this already, please attach a copy of your CLB6.
